Facility level data needed to push government for stronger protections against Omicron

Since the onset of the pandemic, HSA has been pushing government to protect health science and community social service professionals on the front lines.

Our union led the way by commissioning original research by Dr. John Murphy an expert on occupational hygiene and adjunct professor at the Dalla Lana School of Public Health, University of Toronto, for evidence-based guidance showing N95 masking was the most effective strategy against airborne spread of COVID-19.
